**CARBON CAPTURE AND STORAGE:
CAN IT BE DONE AND HOW WILL IT BE REGULATED?**

In order to reduce greenhouse gas emissions, it has been suggested that it will be necessary to capture greenhouse gases, such as carbon dioxide, from sources such as power plants and refineries, and store the gases underground. This program will examine the feasibility of carbon capture and storage and associated legal issues, from both federal and state perspectives. The speakers will:

- Provide an overview of what is currently known about the feasibility and likely costs of using carbon capture and storage to reduce greenhouse gas emissions.
- Review carbon capture and storage legislative and regulatory developments at the federal, regional, and state levels, including the new draft rule recently made available for public comment by U.S. EPA under the Underground Injection Control program.
- Review model state rules developed by the Interstate Oil and Gas Compact Commission.
- Introduce the audience to other legal issues associated with carbon capture and storage such as: (1) ownership of the underlying formations and the injected carbon dioxide; and (2) liability - including the basis for liability, established liability frameworks, and strategies for managing liability long-term.
